

**ANNOUNCEMENT AFTER THE PRESS CONFERENCE OF THE NATIONAL
ELECTORAL COMMISSION HELD ON
7 JUNE 2009 AT 22.35 CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS.**

On 7 June 2009 at 22.35 CET a press conference concerning the European Parliament Elections 2009 was held at the headquarters of the National Electoral Commission.

At the press conference, NEC's chairman Ferdynand Rymarz announced that at 22.00CET the vote in the elections to the European Parliament ended. The vote continued in a peaceful atmosphere, no incidents influencing the results of the elections were recorded. Several minor incidents were reported. After their evaluation, they shall be referred to municipal courts.

The National Electoral Commission was notified of the fact that not all polling stations were properly prepared. NEC's Chairman Ferdynand Rymarz mentioned several areas for future improvements. Legislative works on alternative methods of voting should be accelerated. In the future, proxy voting shall be enabled, and in the case of the blind, Braille's alphabet shall be provided. In addition, voting via the Internet shall be enabled. The Sejm shall be notified of any further observations.

Local electoral commissions are currently counting the votes and establishing the results in individual districts.

The electronic transmission of the results will commence at midnight and the results will be officially announced to the public as they are acquired from 25% and consequently 50%, 75% and 95% polling stations in the country. The results will be unofficial. The official results, based on the protocols delivered from 13 districts to Warsaw, will be announced in the evening hours of 8 June 2009.
